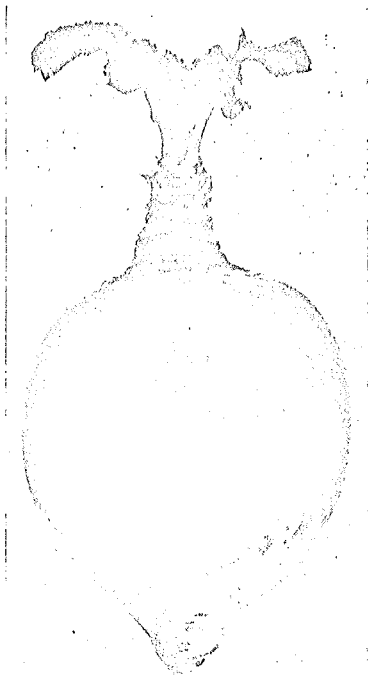

This new Swede is a distinct advance on any other of the early or medium varieties in cultivation. The flesh is solid, very sweet, and the colour of the skin is of a bright pale purple shade. It is a tremendous cropper, matures early, keeps well until early spring, and should be eaten off before our Balmoral P.T. is lifted. It is a deep globe in shape, and should not be sown on very exposed situations

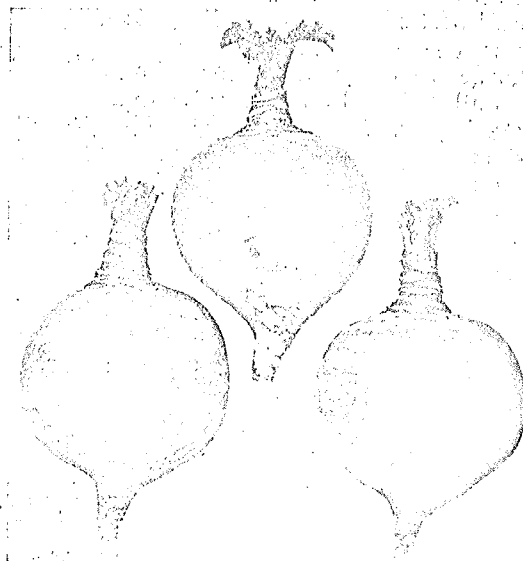

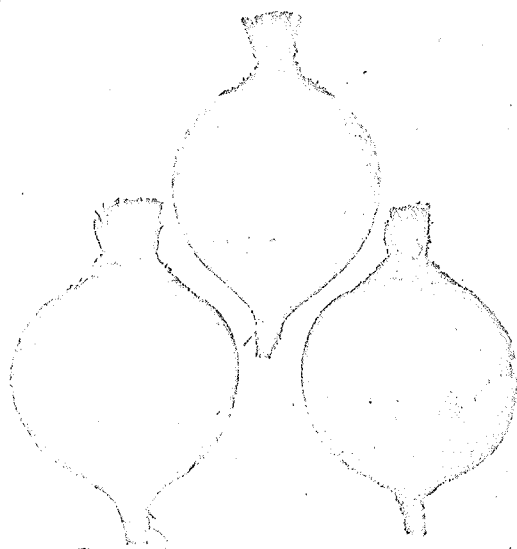

It produces almost as heavy a crop per acre as other well known varieties of yellows, is as hard as a Swede, keeps well into the Spring months and the feeding quality is all that can be desired.

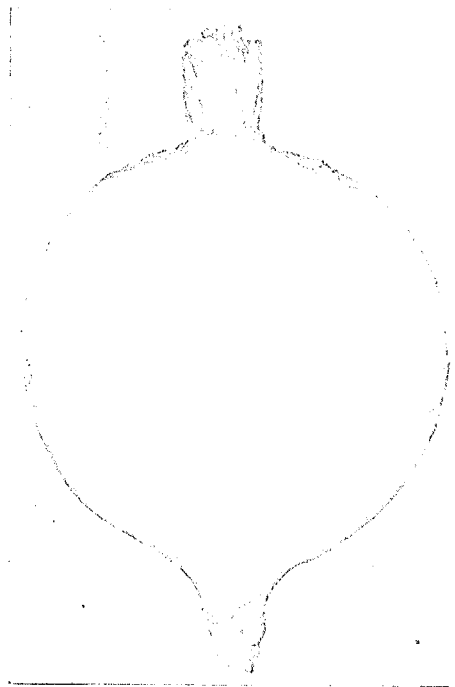
